In response to your correspondence dated January 7, 2019, the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) - International Events and Convention Services Program (IECSP) officially recognizes the following event:

## 2019 Jukasa Motor Speedway Events

June 1<sup>st</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup>, 22, 2019 July 13<sup>th</sup> & 25th, 2019 August 31st, 2019 September 1<sup>st</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Jukasa Motor Speedway Hagersville, Ontario

It should be noted that exhibitors may import goods temporarily as outlined in the provisions of tariff classification **9993.00.00.00** duty free, on the condition that the goods will be exported from Canada upon the completion of the event.

Goods imported for sale are not eligible under tariff No. 9993.00.00.00. These goods must be accounted for at time of release on a <u>Form B3</u>, *Canada Customs Coding Form*. Commercial release processing is fully explained in Customs Memorandum <u>D17-1-5</u>.

Please be advised that the following goods qualify for temporary importation under this tariff item:

- 1. Racing vehicles
- 2. Trailers and conveyances for moving racing vehicles
- 3. Repair parts and repair equipment such as tires, wheels and spare parts
- 4. Tools and portable shop equipment required to maintain a racing vehicle
- 5. Mobile accommodations, mobile kitchens, and related equipment when imported to support the racing team and support personnel and used to promote race related activities.
- 6. Safety vehicles such as first response vehicles and mobile medical unit and related equipment for use solely at the racing event.
- 7. A maximum of three full fuel taker trucks for each racing event. The fuel will be for use only in racing vehicles and not support vehicles. Following the race, any remaining fuel in the take trucks will be exported.
- 8. Television productions trucks and related equipment to produce segments covering your racing events.

Fuel in excess of the normal tank capacity of the racing vehicles, oil, grease, and other consumables are subject to payment of duties and taxes at time of importation into Canada. Listings of goods being imported should be prepared indicating description, quantity and values.



Provided, at the time of importation, the conditions of temporary importation previously described are met, the IECSP recommends that both the requirement for the goods to be documented on a Form E29B and the posting of a security deposit be waived.

It has been noted that you have not appointed an "Official Customs Brokers" to effect Customs clearance of goods destined for your event.

CBSA requires everyone seeking admission into Canada to properly declare themselves to CBSA by providing accurate identification. CBSA will accept a valid passport as proof of citizenship.

Persons who have been convicted of any criminal offences may be inadmissible to Canada. Visa-exempt foreign nationals, excluding U.S. citizens, now require an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to fly to or transit through Canada.
